- **Description:**

- The Eiffel Tower, known as “La Tour Eiffel,” is one of the most iconic landmarks in the world. - **Photography:** For the best photos, consider visiting Trocadéro Square, located directly across the Seine from the Eiffel Tower, especially during sunrise or sunset.
- **Dining:** Consider dining at one of the tower’s restaurants, such as 58 Tour Eiffel on the first level or Le Jules Verne on the second level, for a memorable experience.
- **Accessibility:** The Eiffel Tower is accessible to people with disabilities, with elevators available to the first and second levels.
