

Sainte-Chapelle in Paris

- **Description:**

- Sainte-Chapelle is a stunning Gothic chapel located within the medieval Palais de la Cité on the Île de la Cité in Paris. It was commissioned by King Louis IX (Saint Louis) and completed in 1248.  - **Design:** The upper chapel, where the relics were once displayed, is a masterpiece of light and color. The walls are almost entirely composed of stained glass, supported by delicate stone tracery.
 - **Rose Window:** The magnificent rose window on the western wall, added in the late 15th century, depicts the Apocalypse and is an excellent example of Flamboyant Gothic style.
 - **Vaulted Ceiling:** The vaulted ceiling is painted a deep blue and adorned with golden stars, adding to the celestial atmosphere.
- **The Lower Chapel:**
 - **Purpose:** The lower chapel served as a place of worship for the palace staff and features a more restrained but equally beautiful design.
 - **Decorations:** It has a lower ceiling with ribbed vaults and is decorated with frescoes and statues of saints.
